2017-18 College Access Corps Position Description

TITLE: College Access Corps Coordinator for Washington Middle School

HOURS OF SERVICE: 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., M – F with some evening and weekend hours

JOB DESCRIPTION: The College Access Corps Coordinator will serve at Seattle University's Center for Community Engagement. The primary function will be to recruit and train college students from your campus to act as college access coaches to economically disadvantaged 9th -12th grade youth who attend Garfield High School. The CAC Coordinator will serve half time on-site at Garfield High School and half time at the Center for Community Engagemen. The CAC member will also recruit volunteers for National Days of Service. (NOTE: CAC members will have "recurring" access to vulnerable populations and must pass a standard background check and must satisfy the National Service Criminal History Check eligibility criteria pursuant to 45 CFR 2540.202)

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES AND RELATED TASKS:

- Assist in cultivating school/community partnerships
- Promote the goals of the Seattle University Youth Initiative by strengthening the partnership between Garfield High School (GHS) and the Center for Service and Community Engagement.
- Support programming delivered by Upward Bound and Y Scholars.
- Support events sponsored by the Career Center at Garfield High School.
- Support after school programming and events.
- Recruit, select, and train college students as college access coaches
- Build a programmatic infrastructure around college access programming best practices
- Recruit volunteers for National Days of Service and other community service events
- Administer program assessment
- Promote program impacts to internal and external stakeholders
- Participate in College Access Corps trainings, including orientation, mid-year training, graduation, regional cohort meetings and others as available
- Engage in personal reflection
- Engage in ongoing program and curriculum planning for daytime and after-school sessions, in collaboration with Seattle University students, Garfield High School Staff and CCE staff, to improve and expand services.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- ◆ Applicant must be age 18 or older (AA or BA/BS degree preferred)
- ◆ Ability to work well with people of diverse backgrounds
- ◆ Strong organization, problem-solving and written and oral communication skills
- ◆ Basic office computer skills, including word processing
- ◆ Program management (marketing, event planning, training, volunteer management) experience.
